Arthur provided the gear, comprising a Pye Cambridge, EC10, and 10 ele. skybeam. Contacts were slow at first, mainly in adjoining counties, but later things were warmed up with contacts in Sussex, Surrey, Kent etc. By the time Arthur reluctantly packed up, the best Dx was Aberdeen to the north and Herne Bay (Kent) to the south. Several members tried out their RADAR obtaining good fixes on the local. er--ick. GOING METRIC.

There cant be many of you whodont know that the UK is going metric
in the early 1970s- dont confuse metric with decimal. Perhaps not many of
you have thought of the ways in which going metric will affect Hams.

Not only are we changing to metres, kilogrammes etc, but we are
adopting the S.I. (Système Internationale) units. This will replace
the present mix up of Imperial, cgs, MKS, and other odd confusing units,
Fortunately the amp, volt, ohm etc, will be as before, even if the loss
of the cycle shertz some of you a bit.

Size-wise lengths less than one meter are going to be given in
millimetres (in the SI system the first sub-multiple is one thousandth
of the principle unit) So a 10 by 8 by 2 1/2" chassis will be 254x203 63 mm.

A 100 yd reel of 7/029 to wire up the shack will become a 100 metre
reel of 2.5 sq. mm. and it will probably have solid wires not strands,
Co-ax for antennae will come by the metre, with attenuation given in
dB/100 m., capacity in pFs/m. and DC resistances in ohms per Km.
During the transitional period data will be merely arithmetic conversions
to mm. from Imperial standard sizes. TV cables, services RF (Un-
iradio) cables etc will all eventually be made to true metric sizes, which
are at present being compiled.
