A DX Cluster is a network of computers that collect and disseminate information about amateur radio DX (long-distance) contacts. These computers, called nodes, are linked together to form a larger network, or cluster. Users connect to these nodes to share information about DX spots, send messages, and access various other features.

Cluster Commands

DX cluster commands allow users to interact with DX (long-distance) cluster networks, primarily used by amateur radio operators to share information about spotted stations and other DX-related data. Common commands include <code>SHOW/DX</code> to view recent spots, <code>SET/NAME</code> to set user information, and various filtering options to refine the displayed information.
